


It is not clear how to measure "perceived benefits" in this study. Is it reflected by knowledge? attitude? or is there a specific variable to define this terminology? how to measure it? and where are the results and discussion about it? Another main issue to consider, is whether or not multivariate analysis should be conducted, and if so, what considerations the researchers used to select the variables entered into the model. It is not clearly explained how to define a variable to be a confounding factor (clear and correct justification needs to be mentioned in the paper, including cited references). Should add current references from international journals in the topic of perceived benefit of breastfeeding practices/exclusive breastfeeding
