Background: Although, a significant number of long-lasting insecticide-treated nets (LLINs) had been distributed in the previous years, the prevalence of malaria is a growing concern in Ethiopia. Therefore, this study assessed the utilization of LLINs and associated factors among households in the Ziway Dugda district, Ethiopia.

Methods: A cross-sectional study design was conducted among 728 households. A structured questionnaire adapted from the malaria indicator survey and observation checklist was used to collect data. The data were checked, coded and entered using Epi-data Version 3.1 and exported to SPSS Windows version 20 for analysis. An adjusted odds ratio with 95% confidence interval and significant threshold of p<0.05 was used to report factors associated with utilization of LLINs.

Results: 684 households were interviewed. Of these, 508(74.3%) had utilized at least one LLIN the night before the interview. The factors, average household income of 100-299 Ethiopian Birr (AOR = 0.42, 95% CI; 0.22-0.78), presence of at least one child under the age of five in the household (AOR = 1.49, 95% CI; 1.001-2.218) and respondent knowledge regarding malaria transmission and prevention (AOR = 1.64, 95% CI; 1.02-2.62) were associated with household's utilization of LLIN.

Conclusion: Compared to the World Health Organization Roll Back Malaria target, LLIN utilization was low despite the definite risk of malaria transmission in the area. Therefore, the district health office and health workers should improve malaria awareness, and encourage households to utilize the available nets.
