Reviewer B:

This paper is discussing on the effect shariah compliant practice among the banks in Indonesia and banks' performance. The main contribution from this study is the relationship between the level of shariah compliant practise and their performance.

Based on my evaluation, I recommend this paper to be rejected based on the followings -

- Lack of sufficient data to establish the statements presented as a part of the research. The data is based on financial statement of the banks (year 2012-2016). This is considered not current and outdated.
- Besides, the independent variable proxy for Shariah compliant practise adopted in this study is based on the model introduced by Hassan 2011 which is considered obsolete. Considering the rapid growth experience by Islamic finance industry for the last 20 years, using 9 years old model is not the best practise.
- The Methods section does not clearly explain on the steps taken on multi linear regression. The following are the steps

Conduct preliminary analyses

- Examine descriptive statistics of the continuous variables
- Check the normality assumption by examining histograms of the continuous variables
- Check the linearity assumption by examining correlations between continuous variables and scatter diagrams of the dependent variable versus independent variables.

Conduct multiple linear regression analysis

- Run model with dependent and independent variables
- Model Check
  - Examine collinearity diagnostics to check for multicollinearity
  - Examine residual plots to check error variance assumptions (i.e., normality and homogeneity of variance)
  - Examine influence diagnostics (residuals, dtbetas) to check for outliers
  - Examine significance of coefficient estimates to trim the model

Write the final regression equation and interpret the coefficient estimates

- Lack of sufficient data to establish the statements presented as a part of the research. The arguments and data presented are not complete in establishing the core idea presented. Results presented are statistically not valid
